



The Central California Kart Racing Association (CCKRA) is closely monitoring the ever-changing COVID-19 situation. The health and safety of our members and attendees is the highest priority. Kart Racing Events are open-air events that do not require gatherings in confined spaces. Therefore, based on CDC recommendations and State of California regulations, we will implement the following steps to reduce risk of spreading the virus.

If you are sick, have been sick, or have been exposed to the virus in the past 14 days – **DO NOT ATTEND.**

YOU ARE REQUIRED TO BRING YOUR OWN MASK, HELMET, GLOVES, SUIT, NECK DEVICE, AND PEN TO THIS EVENT.

THIS IS A PRIVATE EVENT – IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY WITH OUR POLICY, YOU WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE. THIS IS NON-NEGOTIABLE.

Before Competition

Setup:

- All setup workers are required to wear masks when within 12 feet of the trailer or any other person.
- All early setup workers are required to wear disposable gloves as appropriate.
- All equipment and contact surfaces will be sanitized including, but not limited to, all tabletops, radios, laptops, etc.
- Hand sanitation stations will be set up near the trailer, at corner stations, and the waiver station.
- A worker will be designated to manage all PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) and sanitization.

Check-in & Registration:

- **ONLINE REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT IS REQUIRED. NO ON-SITE REGISTRATION.**
- **NO SPECTATORS ALLOWED ON SITE.**
- Contactless check-in at the trailer is required.
- A barrier will be set up to ensure 6+ feet between registration workers and attendees.
- Corner worker assignments will be given during check-in.
- Online registration will close two days prior to the event at 11:59 PM.
- **MASKS ARE REQUIRED FOR EVERYONE IN LINE DURING CHECK-IN.**
- If a line forms (not expected), keep 6+ feet between you and the next person in line. We will use cones to mark the distance.



Waiver Station:

- A table will be set up at the waiver station.
- Masks are required for anyone near or approaching the waiver station.
- Waivers and wrist bands will be placed on the table for attendees to sign.
- Attendees should sign the waiver **USING THEIR OWN PEN.**

Tech Inspection:

- Driver must be present and kart will be self-teched under supervision.
- Tech workers will wear a mask and disposable gloves.
- Disposable gloves should be discarded or sanitized after each kart, unless touchless inspection was performed.
- Touching interior surfaces will be avoided if possible.

Drivers Meeting and Course Walking:

- The drivers meeting will be **ANNOUNCED OVER THE PA SYSTEM**. All attendees are required to listen, and should spread out liberally to maintain social distancing.
- Course walks should avoid groups of more than 4, and follow social distancing guidelines mentioned in this policy. Drivers will also get one or as necessary “parade lap/warm-up.”

Social Distancing and PPE (all day)

All attendees will follow current CDC guidelines for social distancing, including, but not limited to:

- KEEP A MINIMUM OF 6 FEET AWAY FROM PEOPLE
- Wear a mask. **If you do not wear a mask at the entry gate, you will not be admitted.**
- **No water or food will be provided;** please bring your own, especially water.
- No one allowed in the Scoring Trailer except timing and scoring workers.
- Avoiding handshaking.
- Cover coughs with elbow.
- Avoiding touching your face.
- Wash and/or sanitize hands frequently.
- Please use common sense and err on the side of caution.

Masks are **REQUIRED** for everyone in the following designated areas or situations:

- Waiver station
- During check-in
- Bathrooms
- Inside and within 50 feet of the Timing Trailer
- During setup and cleanup operations
- Grid worker and Starter
- Additional areas may be designated by the event chair or safety steward



Masks are also **REQUIRED** in the following situations:

- Instructing.
- Within 12 feet of someone.
- Working as corner captain.

During Competition

Drivers:

- Drivers must follow all social distancing guidelines mentioned in this policy.
- **LOANER HELMETS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE.**
- **NO ARRIVE AND DRIVES WILL BE PERMITTED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.**
- Co-driving (sharing the same car) is permitted, as long as social distancing guidelines are met.
- Bottled water will not be available. Please bring your own.
- The Scoring Trailer will be closed, except to essential personnel.
- The grid will be set up with double the normal spacing to allow social distancing.
- Driver must stay in kart on grid between heats except to check tire pressures, drink water or seek shade.

Corner Workers:

- Sanitizing supplies will be provided at all corner stations and should be used frequently on all equipment and mandatory between heat groups.
- **CORNER CAPTAINS ARE REQUIRED TO SANITIZE RADIOS BEFORE AND AFTER EACH SESSION.**
- All corner workers should wash or sanitize their hands before and after their work session.
- Disposable gloves can be used, in addition to other hand hygiene measures.

After Competition

- Masks and gloves are required for cleanup operations.

Cancellation Policy

- Cancel before registration closes – full refund.
- Cancel after registration closes – refund, minus \$10 cancellation fee.
- If you cannot attend due to feeling sick, or any reason related to the coronavirus, a full refund will be provided regardless of when you cancel.
- All refunds must be initiated by contacting the registrar via E-mail.
- Online registration will close two days prior at 11:59 PM.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

Q: What is an appropriate mask?

A: Any cloth covering is considered to be a mask provided it covers mouth and nose with more than one layer and can stay fixed to your face. We would prefer that it meets CDC recommendations.

Q: Can I do an Arrive and Drive?

A: Unfortunately, at this time and out of the abundance of caution, we are not allowing any Arrive and Drives. We will revisit this policy as the year progresses.

Q: I see people not following the COVID-19 guidelines in this policy – what should I do?

A: We are hoping that folks are respectful of our policy and don't anticipate problems, however, if that situation arises, please contact the Race Director, CCKRA President, or any CCKRA BoD. The first time will be a warning and if there is a second time, the driver will forfeit their heats/points and will be asked to exit the event. The CCKRA Event could also be Shut-Down for Failure to Comply to CDC COVID-19/Fresno Fairgrounds Policies and Procedures.

Q: I forgot my mask – what should I do?

A: You should be wearing your mask when you approach the entry gate in the morning. We would ask that you run home to get your mask. There is also a Walmart close by and a mask can be made from a t- shirt as shown on the CDC website (link above). If this is absolutely not feasible, at the discretion of the CCKRA President, a mask may be provided to you from our limited worker supply, but as a last resort.

Q: I brought a mask, but during the event, it broke – what should I do?

A: Bring a back-up mask just in case. We will have a limited quantity of worker masks which we may supply to you in that situation, but this is a last resort.

Q: I forgot a pen – what should I do?

A: We will have a limited supply of pens available at the waiver station. If you use a pen, it is yours to keep. DO NOT RETURN ANY PENS.

Q: I forgot to register online – what should I do?

A: Unfortunately, at this time, we are not allowing anyone on site who has not registered online. Additionally, no spectators are allowed.





COVID-19 Non-Medical Employer Screening Tool For CCKRA Employees and Participants

Ask the following questions at the beginning of every shift:

Questions	Answer	Action
Feeling fever, body aches, or chills?	YES or NO	If yes ⑦ go home
Respiratory symptoms? (New or worsening short of breath, cough, or runny nose)	YES or NO	If yes ⑦ go home
<p>If employee has no fever and respiratory symptoms, they can work AFTER washing their hands and need to follow social distancing, frequent hand hygiene and cleaning of their workspace throughout the workday.</p> <p>Masking with cloth mask is recommended in non-clinical roles if employee works around other employees or public, and physical distancing (6 feet apart at all times) is not possible due to the nature of the work.</p> <p>Reminder: Cloth masks are not as effective as physical distancing (6 feet apart).</p>		

Disclaimer: This is a recommended template; employers can use it as it is or can use it to create a screening tool that works best for their work environment.

COVID-19 Non-Medical Employer Screening Tool FAQ's

1. What about agricultural workers?

2. When do I ask these questions? What type of documentation is needed?
 - The Fresno County Department of Public Health (FCDPH) recommends that all employees be screen at the beginning of the workday. This can be done in any format that works for your work environment; this checklist can be a paper or phone application, at the door or at the workstation. Employers need to keep a log of all employees who were told to go home
3. What are instructions for workers who need to go home?
 - Most people will have mild symptoms and can recover at home
 - Employees need to self-isolate; stay in a separate room and away from other family members as much as possible
 - Employees should not share food, drinks, sheets or towel with other family members
 - Cover sneeze and cough with tissue or elbow space and wash hands frequently
 - Clean all “high touch” surfaces often, or at least daily
 - Monitor their symptoms and if they experience constant chest pain, have trouble breathing and are unable to eat or drink, they should call their doctor or go to the hospital
4. When can an individual **return to work**?
 - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has two separate guidelines depending on if patient was tested or not:
 - i. If not tested for COVID-19, they can return to work:
 - If they have no fever for 3 days without the aid of medications, **and** show improvement in respiratory symptoms, **and**
 - At least 7 days out from first day of illness
 - ii. If tested for COVID-19 and were positive, they can return to work:
 - If they have no fever for 3 days without the aid of medications **and** show improvement in respiratory symptoms, **and**
 - Have two negative tests collected >24 hours apart
 - **Due to shortage of test kits and delay in getting test results, the FCDPH recommends using non-test based strategy** to determine who can return to work, regardless if person was tested or not, that is resolution of fever for three days without the aid of medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms, and 7 days from first day of illness (whichever is longer)





- For individuals who **NEVER had any symptoms** but were **tested POSITIVE**, they can return to work:
 - If they never had any subsequent illness, they can return to work after at least 7 days have passed since the date of their first positive COVID- 19 diagnostic test
- If individual had an **exposure** but **never had any symptoms** and were told to self-isolate, they can return to work **after 14 days of self-isolation are over**

- 5. What if an employee has allergies or asthma, do they need to go home?
 - If their symptoms (runny nose, sneezing, or cough) has **NOT changed** from their baseline, then they **can work**
 - If their symptoms have **WORSENERD**, then they need to **go home**

- 6. What if an employee tests positive for COVID-19?
 - Their **CLOSE contacts (<6 ft apart for >10 minutes)** will need to be contacted to inform them about their exposure and risk. Use the screening tool above to determine if they can work or not

- 7. What if an employee had an exposure but doesn't have any symptoms?
 - People who had **close contact** with a **symptomatic or confirmed COVID-19 person** but themselves don't have any symptoms, need to self-isolate for 14 days
 - People who **did NOT have close contact** with a **symptomatic or confirmed COVID-19 person**, can return to work and self-monitor for signs/symptoms of infection and should leave work immediately if they start to feel ill
